# Focus on the areas wildlife

Polzeath is an internationally renowned area for it's sea life and rightly so, from Basking Sharks and Grey Seals to Starfish and everything in between. Out of the water a whole other world of animals exist from Birds to insects.

Of the insects, moths are very over looked but at this time of year flying along the coast path during the day you may come across a small yellow species. The Speckled Yellow is easy to identify, being yellow with numerous black spots. You could help local experts in mapping their distribution. Please report your sightings of the flora and fauna you spot to the Marine Centre.

# **POLPIP Grey Seal Survey**

POLPIP stands for Polzeath Photo Identification Project and has now been running for four years. Together with the Cornwall Seal Group, we conduct boat surveys along the coast, from Trevose Head to Boscastle, of all Grey Seal encountered. As many Grey Seals are photographed so that individuals can be identified from the unique spot patterns. Whilst looking for the seals, all other sealife encountered is recorded and mapped.
